bipolar patients and their families. Nurse practitioners (NP's) and physician assistants (PA's) make a substantial contribution in the recognition and care of patients with bipolar disorder including assessment of psychiatric and medical comorbidities. Additionally, by their training and experience, NP's and PA's are well suited to facilitate optimal patient care in collaboration with other healthcare team members.

Nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and other health care professionals treating patients with bipolar disorder are encouraged to participate.
