BACKGROUND

Personal: 53-year-old Caucasian male, Attorney

MEDICATION TRIALS

Past trials: Venlafaxine XR 150 mg with Aripiprazole 15 mg

Current regimen: Venlafaxine 150 mg

CURRENT PRESENTATION

Chief Complaint: Oral movements

Psychiatric Interview Findings : This successful attorney has a history of recurrent MDD. Five years ago his depression failed to respond adequately to trials of venlafaxine, citalopram, or sertraline. Aripiprazole was added to his venlafaxine as an adjunctive medication. His depression improved within 2 weeks and he continued on this combination for the next 6 months. His wife noticed increased oral movements which became apparent to the patient when he looked in the mirror. After calling his psychiatrist, the aripiprazole was discontinued but the oral movements persist. Patient reports that the "movements with my mouth" are interfering with my job as an attorney.

Mental Status And Behavioral Observations: Patient is currently euthymic.

Physical Exam Findings: Vital signs are normal. Neurological exam is abnormal for oral movements. These consist of occasional lip puckering with some additional chewing movements. Lip and jaw movements are rated as 2 on the AIMS exam.

PSYCHIATRIC HISTORY, MEDICAL HISTORY, AND OTHER HISTORY

History of diabetes, well controlled with metformin and GLP-1 agonist.

DIAGNOSIS

- MDD, recurrent
- Tardive Dyskinesia secondary to aripiprazole treatment

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
