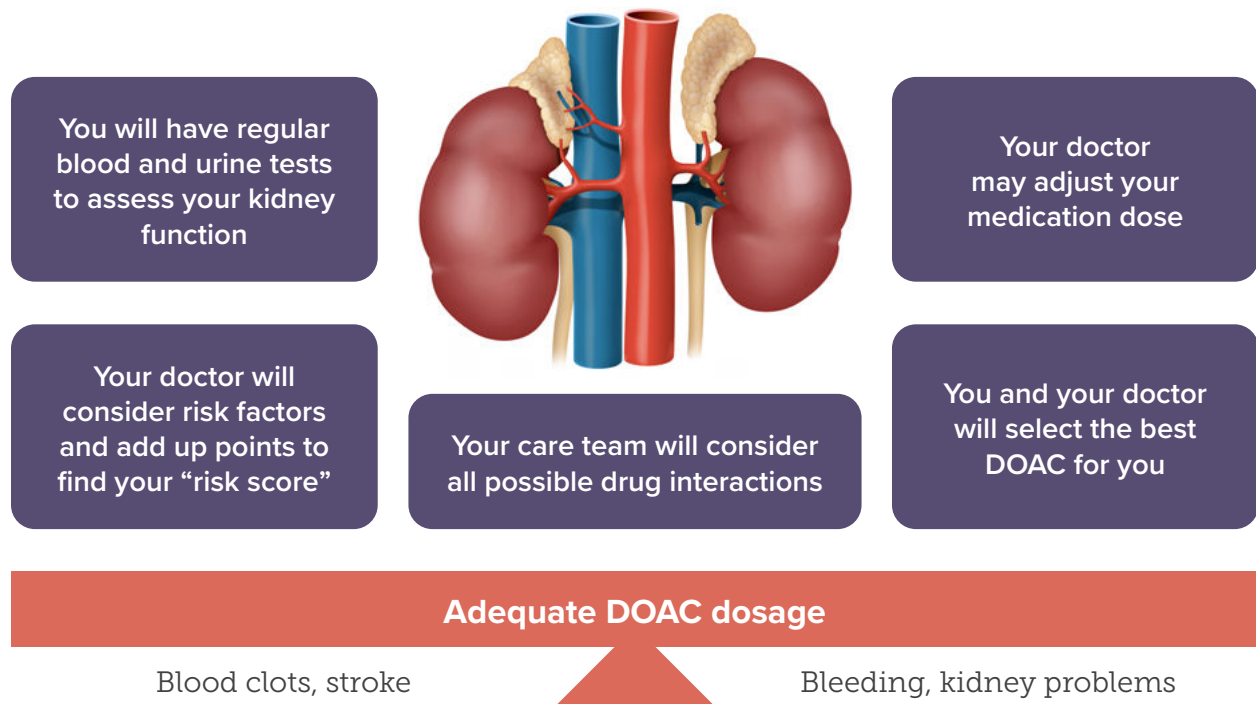


Striking the Balance
